
This will confirm the finding of the Florida Commission on Hurricane Loss Projection Methodology on June 2, 2005, that the AIR Worldwide Corporation computer model has been determined acceptable for projecting hurricane loss costs for personal residential rate filings.

The Commission has determined that the Atlantic Tropical Cyclone Model V7.0 complies with the Standards adopted by the Commission on October 6&7, 2004, and concludes that the Atlantic Tropical Cyclone Model V7.0 is sufficiently accurate and reliable for projecting hurricane loss costs for residential property in Florida.

In accordance with the Commission's procedures, this determination of acceptability expires on February 28, 2006, unless the modeler has complied with the latest adopted procedures described in the "Process for the Determination of Acceptability of a Computer Simulation Model" in order to maintain its acceptability.
