Dear Dr. Brolley:

This will confirm the finding of the Florida Commission on Hurricane Loss Projection Methodology on June 2, 2015, that the CoreLogic EQECAT computer model has been determined acceptable for projecting hurricane loss costs and probable maximum loss levels for residential rate filings. The determination of acceptability expires on November 1, 2017.

The Commission has determined that the CoreLogic EQECAT Florida Hurricane Model 2015a limited to the options selected in the input form provided in Standard A-1 (Modeling Input Data) Disclosure 5 complies with the standards adopted by the Commission on September 24 & 25, 2013, and concludes that the CoreLogic EQECAT Florida Hurricane Model 2015a limited to the Florida hurricane model options selected (Standard A-1 (Modeling Input Data) Disclosure 5) is sufficiently accurate and reliable for projecting hurricane loss costs and probable maximum loss levels for residential property in Florida.
