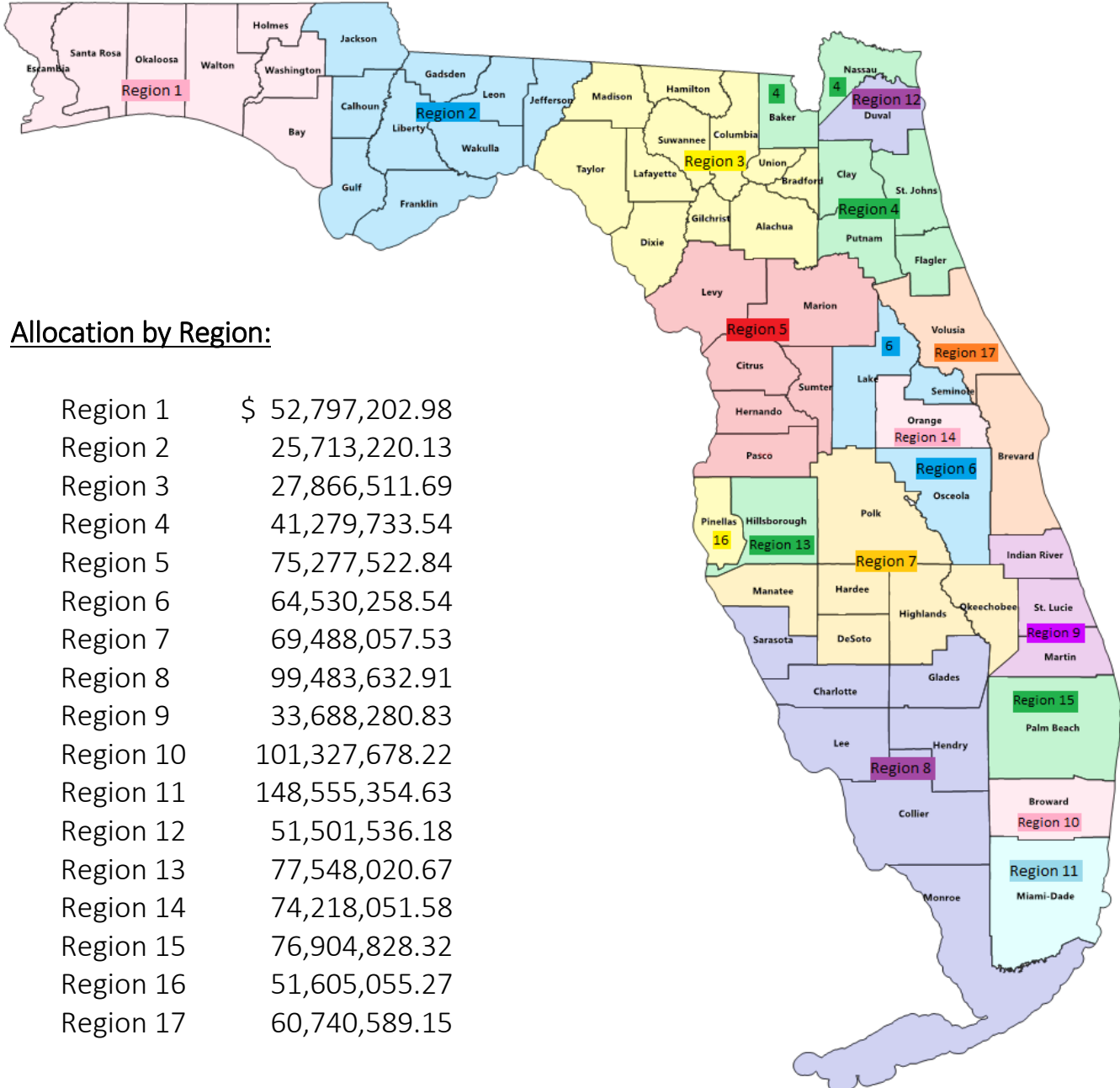

Pursuant to Section 146(d) of the Internal Revenue Code, the State volume cap for Florida for calendar year 2021 is calculated to be an amount equal to \$110 multiplied by the State population. Section 3.21 of Rev. Proc. 2020-45 increased the per capita amount used to calculate the State volume cap from \$105 to \$110 for calendar year 2021. Section 146(j) of the Internal Revenue Code requires States to calculate their annual state volume cap based on the most recent census estimate of the resident population of such State released by the Bureau of Census before the beginning of such calendar year. The most recent Annual Estimates of the Resident Population for the United States, Regions, States, and Puerto Rico was released by the Bureau of Census in December 2019. In the event that a new Annual Estimates of the Resident Population for the United States, Regions, States, and Puerto Rico is released on or before December 31, 2020, the State volume cap for calendar year 2021 will be recalculated.
